Fluō – an interdisciplinary artist collective and laboratory.

We are Flu \bar{o} , a new professional dance collective and at the same time an artistic laboratory that connects different worlds. Our team is made up of skilled professionals from diverse artistic fields, united by a passion for experimentation and the search for new forms of expression.

Our work is built on passion, courage, and openness. We believe in the power of collaboration – that is why we bring dance into dialogue with costume design, light design, scenography, painting, and the visionary approaches of students and graduates of CTU (Czech Technical University) and UMPRUM (Academy of Arts, Architecture and Design in Prague). Our ambition is to create a living platform that looks forward and develops contemporary art.

Fluō thinks in the long term. We are searching for innovative ways to connect people through dance, to inspire each other, and to create a safe space for experimentation within the living arts.

Our activities also include workshops and lectures for the public, designed to open the world of dance and contemporary art to anyone interested. Our goal is to make dance accessible to a wider audience and to restore its original purpose – to bring people together.

The first major outcome of our work is the full-length performance SPRING.





JARO - SPRING as a theme of birth, renewal, blossoming, transformation. SPRING, primavera, the season of new beginnings. A time that sheds its greyness. SPRING is a reference to the next natural cycle, returning to rituals once inseparable from this period. It is an homage to nature, an acknowledgment of its power, and a shedding of everything that hinders its flourishing. Today, only fragments of those rituals remain, stripped of their deeper meaning.

The dance-visual performance SPRING becomes an essay about our present, carrying traces of the past – a sense of belonging, of perceiving oneself as part of an ecosystem. Meanwhile, society has moved forward with no regard for the natural order. Yet the order of nature continues ceaselessly, only interrupted by humankind sneaking in, convinced it can change the rules of the game.

A quartet of dancers moves in the rhythm of social patterns they have adopted without questioning why. They have accepted this current, accustomed themselves to it. But what if it runs directly against them? What if nature carries within itself a much greater wisdom – one that has been utterly forgotten in our times?

Its strength lies in the simple flow of time without intervention, in the power of renewal and decay. A cycle that makes sense, a belief in endlessly streaming life, a perception of the world as a continuum unfolding in the present moment. It is space and time at once, ordinary and extraordinary, past and future.

We are trapped in the in-between, caught between present and future. We are neither here nor there. And so we return to the past – to the old perception of "lived nature" – hoping that it might finally anchor us in a livelier present, in reality itself.

SPRING arrives in empty streets, like an unexpected guest, yet we sit silently inside, struck by our own shadows.
Only the rustling of branches reminds us that the world outside still breathes, even if it sounds like a distant tale.



In 2023 the association KULTUM – You Can Duet., z.s. created a dance project titled CHOICE. It was once again an international collaboration with a Spanish choreographer and former dancer of the renowned Ballets de Monte Carlo. The performances were highly successful, with reprises of CHOICE staged across the Czech Republic: in Ostrava, where the production opened the jubilee tenth edition of MoveFest; in Pilsen with the support of the cultural space Moving Station; and in Prague at MeetFactory. Most of the venues were nearly sold out, and thanks to the interdisciplinary connection of contemporary dance with spoken word performed by National Theatre actor Igor Orozovič, the project succeeded in attracting a diverse audience. The driving forces behind the project were Markéta Pospíšilová, also a former dancer of Ballets de Monte Carlo, and Natálie Paulasová, soloist of the Prague Chamber Ballet.




